Member Spotlight - Peggy Jarvie



Effective March 1, 2018 Peggy Jarvie will retire as Associate Provost, Co-operative and Experiential Education at the University of Waterloo. After receiving word of the retirement, CEIA granted Peggy lifetime member status for her contributions to the field.

Peggy joined Waterloo in 2005 following extensive experience in financial services both in Canada and the U.S. She has led the team in co-op and the [Centre for Career Action](#) through its many notable achievements, including maintaining high co-op employment rates as co-op enrolment grew 70% during changing and challenging economic conditions.

During her tenure, new career support programs were introduced, and student, alumni and staff engagement with career services increased. With her leadership team, she designed and implemented new roles and an organization structure that enabled greater focus on various stakeholder groups including students, employers and faculty. She has encouraged the increasing profile of the Waterloo Centre for the Advancement of Co-operative Education ([WatCACE](#)), which has become a global research leader in co-operative and work-integrated education.

Peggy has contributed to national and international associations and to numerous university councils and committees during her time at Waterloo. Most recently, she led the experiential education strategic theme, which resulted in the [EDGE](#) certificate in experiential education, recently launched to support undergraduates not in co-op programs as they prepare for their careers and lives after graduation.

Webinar Title: College to Career Transition: Leveraging the ADA and Accommodations at Work

Summary: "Students with disabilities who receive accommodations in higher education should be knowledgeable about disability disclosure, and requesting and negotiating reasonable accommodations under title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) when transitioning from college to career. During this session, a representative of the Job Accommodation Network (JAN), shared information about using JAN as a resource, offered practical tips for leveraging the ADA to request accommodations at work, and educated service providers about how to empower graduates with disabilities to self-advocate in the workplace. This presentation was made available through a collaboration between JAN, AHEAD, the AHEAD Career SIG, and the Cooperative Education & Internship Association (CEIA)."
