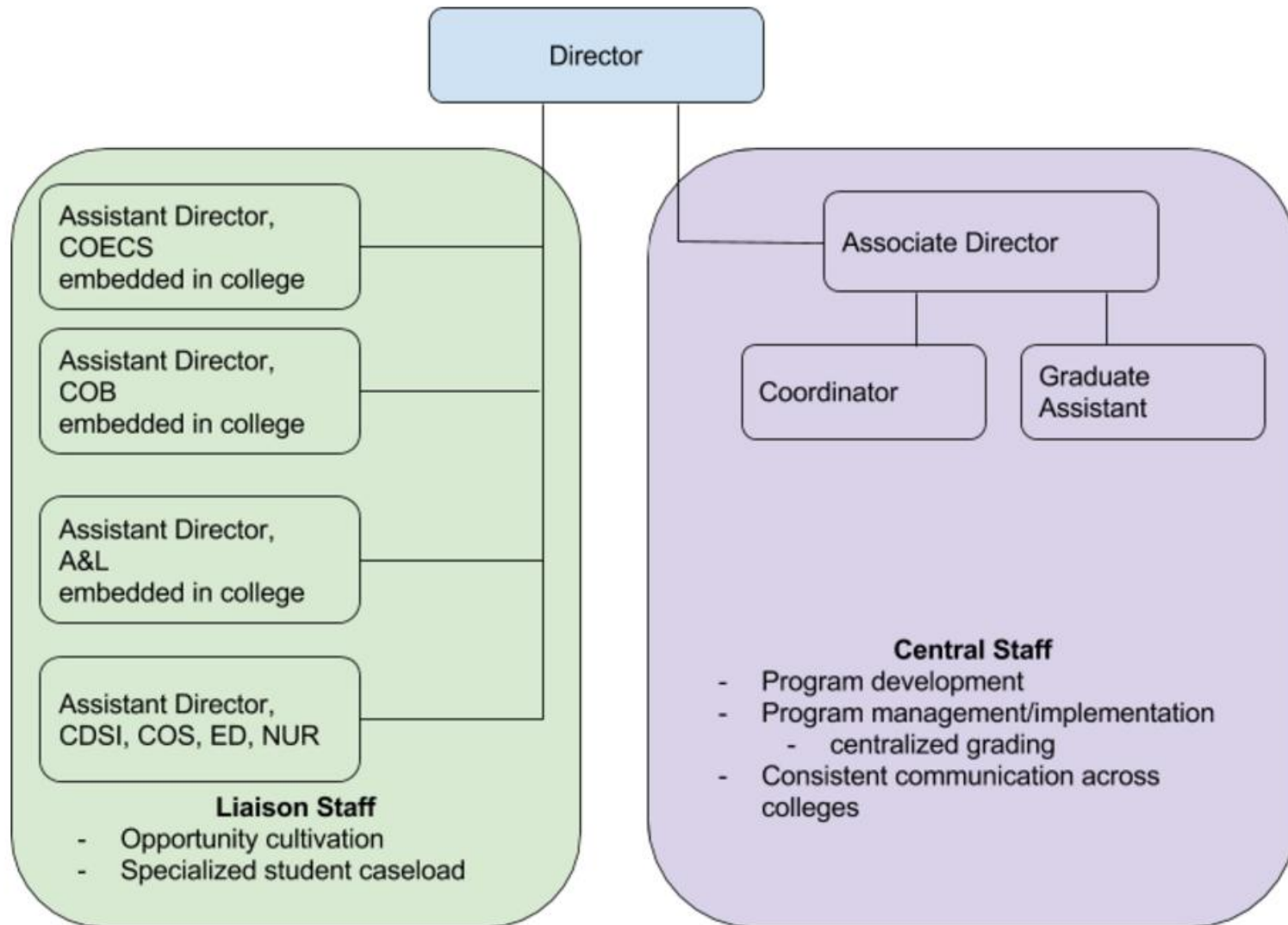

Students complete Pre-Assessment during Registration Appointment with Internship Liaison. The Internship Liaison also introduces the Career Readiness competencies during this session.

Critical Thinking/Problem Solving

Read through the description and ratings for Critical Thinking/Problem Solving. Select the rating you believe best describes your current skill level before beginning your experience.

Critical Thinking/Problem Solving:

- **Description:** Exercise sound reasoning to analyze issues, make decisions, and overcome problems. The individual is able to obtain, interpret, and use knowledge, facts, and data in this process, and may demonstrate originality and inventiveness.

Achieving in Most Areas

I feel capable in this skill, though in a few areas there is still room to grow.

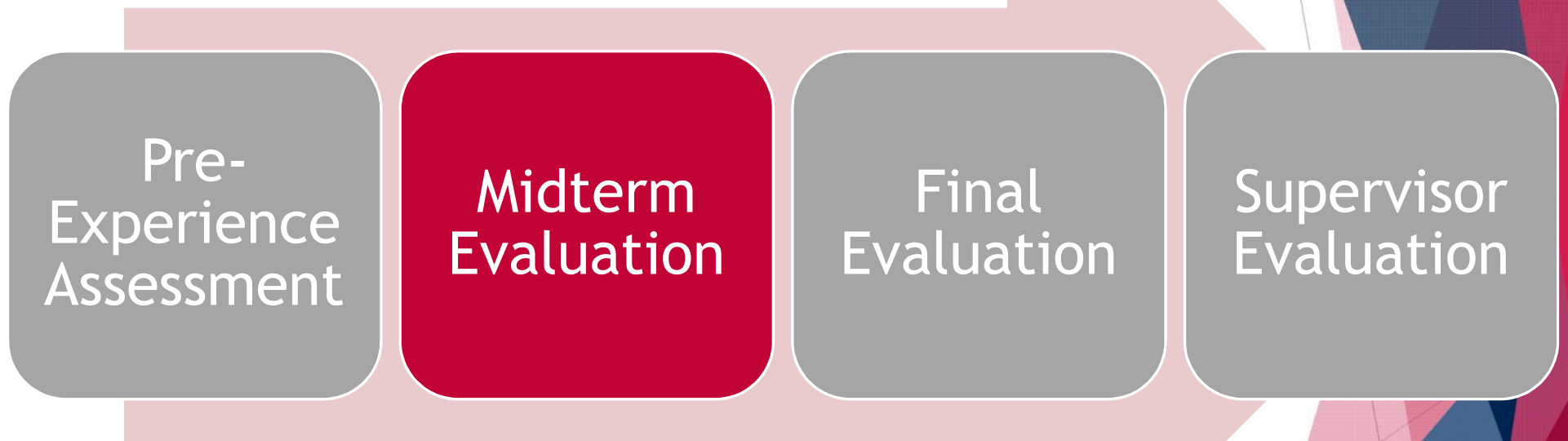

Internship Course Process



Student develops learning objective for each Career Readiness competency. We also offer to share the objectives with the internship supervisors.

Teamwork/Collaboration

Description: Build collaborative relationships with colleagues and customers representing diverse cultures, races, ages, genders, religions, lifestyles, and view points. The individual:

- is able to work within a team structure.
- can negotiate and manage conflict.

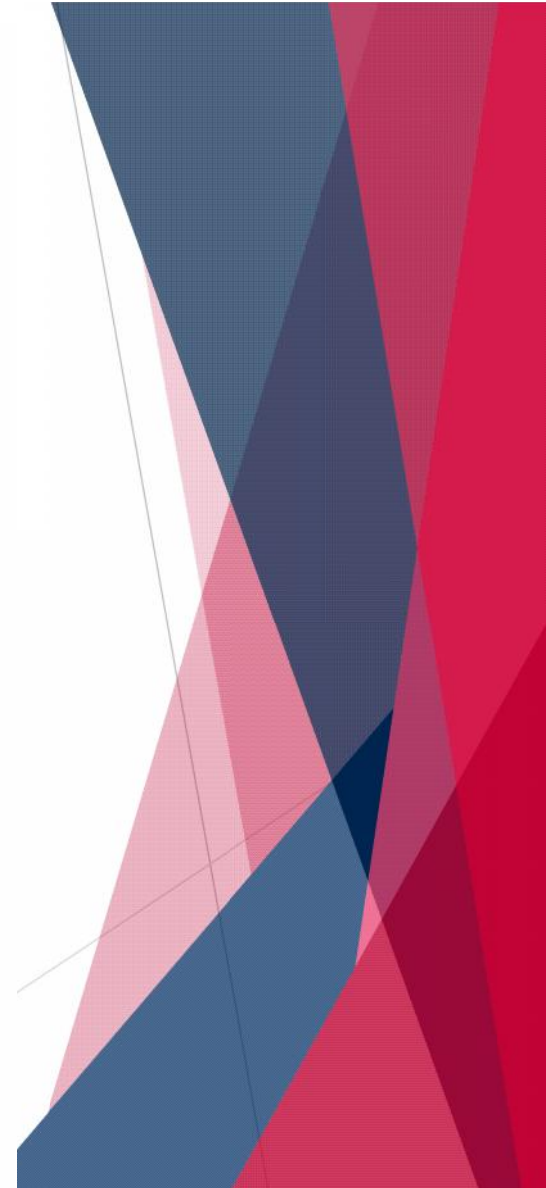

(X) A specific project task/activity/responsibility

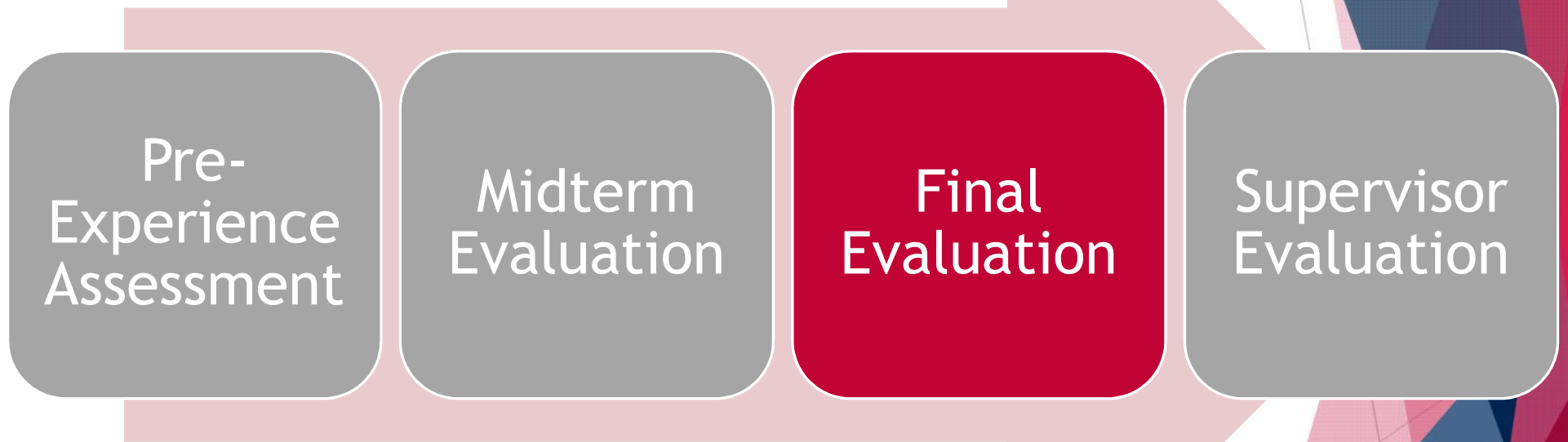
(Y) Intended outcome or skill

Internship Course Process



Students completes Final Evaluation assessing competency level for each Career Ready competency. These responses are measured and compared against the Pre-Experience responses.

Information Technology Application

Achieving in Most Areas

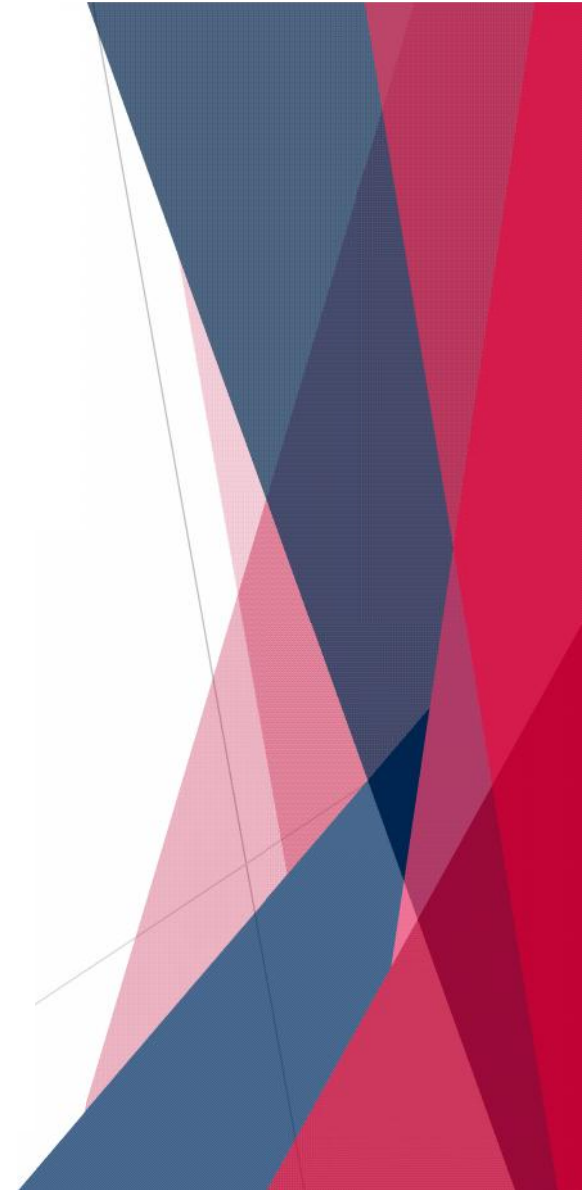
I feel capable in this skill, though in a few areas there is still room to grow.

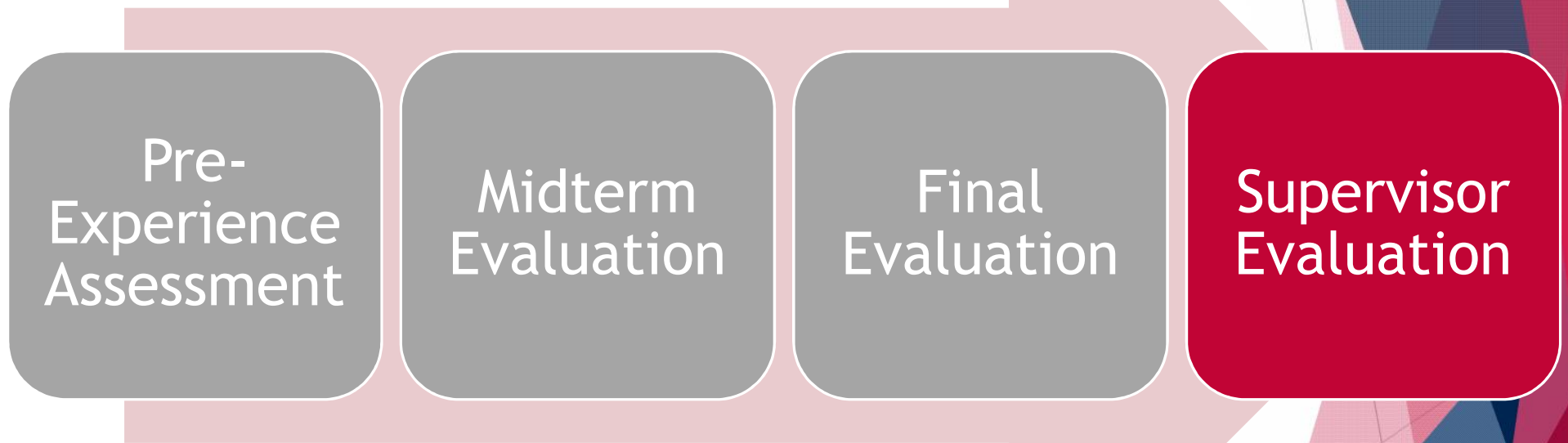

Internship Course Process



Professionalism/Work Ethic:

- **Description:** Demonstrate personal accountability and effective work habits, e.g., punctuality, working productively with others, and time workload management, and understand the impact of non-verbal communication on professional work image. The individual demonstrates integrity and ethical behavior, acts responsibly with the interests of the larger community in mind, and is able to learn from his/her mistakes.

Still Developing

Achieving in Most Areas

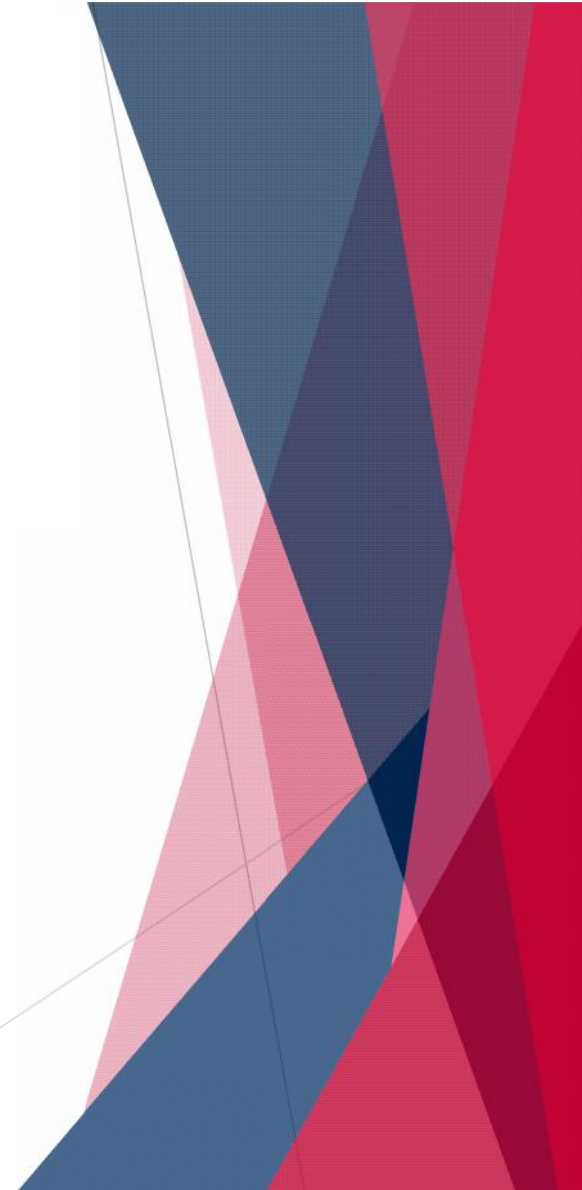
I feel the intern is capable in this skill, though in a few areas there is still room to grow.

Mastery of Content

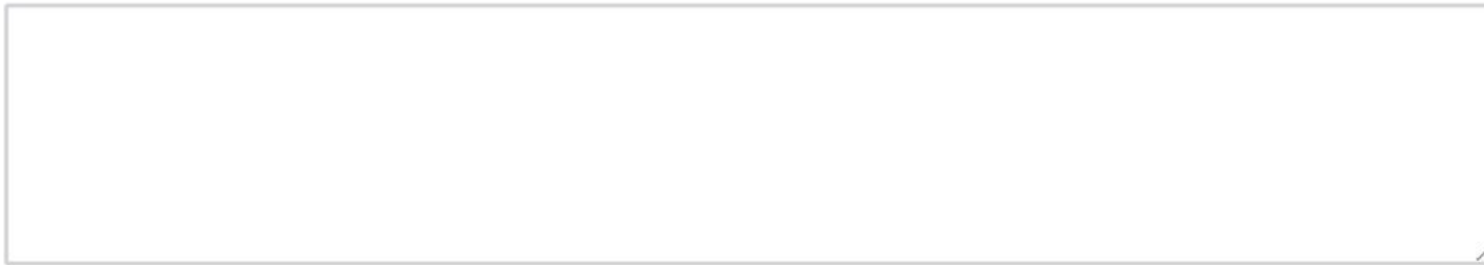
I feel extremely confident in the intern's ability and the intern could be a peer mentor in this category.

Please provide an example from the intern's projects that illustrates why you selected this rating.



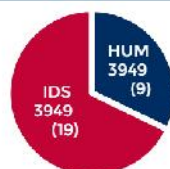

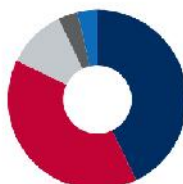
