The CEIA Board of Directors met over two days in late September. The location was the Doubletree Hotel in downtown Nashville – the 2003 conference site. What a great area!



ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY UPDATE

Sher Nielson-Hatley completed the scanning and necessary clean up of the first *Annotated Bibliography of the Journal of Co-operative Education (1964-1983)* that was written by Maurice P. Hartley and Barbara Munson Goff (Cook College, Rutgers The State University of NJ). This was added to the second *Annotated Bibliography (1983-1997)*, which was completed by Richard A. Pullin (University of Waterloo, Ontario).

An introduction and directions for using

a web browser to search it were added and the Vice President for Research and Information, Bruce Smith (Bowling Green State University) did final editing. Now the field of work-integrated learning has thirty-three years of journal article overviews to browse. Article reprints can be ordered through the CEIA office (the order form is there too).


