Keynote Speaker Spotlight



Jillian Kinzie, Ph.D. will deliver the conference keynote address on Monday, April 1, 2019.

CEIA looks forward to welcoming our conference keynote speaker, <u>Jillian Kinzie</u>, <u>Ph.D.</u> Jillian is Associate Director of the Indiana University Center for Postsecondary Research and the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) Institute. She conducts research and leads project activities on effective use of student engagement data to improve educational quality, and serves as senior scholar with the National Institute for Learning Outcomes Assessment (NILOA) project.

Her research interests include assessment of college and university quality, first year student development, teaching and learning in college, equity and student success in college, high-impact practices, learning outcomes assessment, and women in underrepresented fields.

Jillian is co-author of Assessment in Student Affairs (2016), Using Evidence of Student Learning to Improve Higher Education (2015), Student Success in College (2005/2010), and One Size Does Not Fit All: Traditional and Innovative Models of Student Affairs Practice (2008/2014) and has published in many journals including the Journal of Higher Education, Journal of College Student Development, Liberal Education and New Directions for Teaching and Learning. She is co-editor of New Directions in Higher Education and serves on the boards of the Washington Internship Institute, and the Gardner Institute for Excellence in Undergraduate Education.
