








The Response

- Annual planning meeting with Alma Mater Society
- Observations: most students are very engaged but feel pressure to do more
- Need: a way to help students recognize the value of what they're doing \rightarrow build confidence and strategies for moving forward

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The Intervention




- Materials: whiteboard/paper + markers


Collaboration & Impact

Looks Unique on Each Campus






Within Waterloo Co-op




Where you can take this
